26. Phlox, 1 stem
27. Rose, hybrid tea, 1 bloom
28. Rose, grown for fragrance, 1 bloom
29. Rose, floribunda, 1 spray
30. Rose, grandiflora, 1 stem

32. Rose, climber or rambler, 1 stem
